SOS was established in May 2010 in response to the world's dwindling populations of sharks. By utilising a mixture of on-the-ground and online campaigning, educational outreach, and peer-reviewed scientific research, we encourage better protection for sharks, while also promoting better protection of our delicately-balanced ocean ecosystems.



RESEARCH
